

National Public School Kengeri, Bengaluru Report on Karnataka Rajyotsava 2024

Karnataka Rajyotsava, also known as Karnataka State Day, is celebrated annually on 1st November in the Indian state of Karnataka. It commemorates the merger of the Kannada-speaking regions of south western India in 1956, under the States Reorganisation Act to form Karnataka state when states were reorganized on a linguistic basis. Since then, this day has been dedicated to statehood and is celebrated annually.

The students of National Public School, Kengeri, Bengaluru, celebrated the 69th Karnataka Rajyotsava in grandeur, at the school premises, on the theme, 'Pancha Bhoothagalu- five elements of nature'. The secretary of the school, Ms. Divya Avinash, was the chief guest of the day. The Principal, Ms. Geeta Dikshit; the Vice Principal, Ms. Suman Singh, the Centre Head of NPSK Junior wing, Ms Poornima Ramesh, the Co-Ordinators, and the staff also were part of the event. A tapestry of cultural programmes was presented by the students to mark the day.

The students presented the principles of each Panchabhuta in various literary genres of Kannada. Draupadi's birth in 'Gamakavachana' was enacted as Agnitattva; a drama on Bhagiratha's effort was enacted as Jalatattva; Maruti Vijaya Harikatha was presented as Vaayu tattva; Arali katte programme was presented as Aakashatattva, and the dance glory of 'Naadu' in Bhootatattva.

Addressing the gathering, Ms. Divya Avinash, the secretary of the school, reiterated that we should respect our motherland; and that Kannada should be taught and learnt compulsorily by all non-Kannadigas.

During the programme, the spirit of Kannada language and statehood echoed throughout, etching it in the minds of the participants and audience alike.
