Report on Excursion Grade 9-12

The students of Grades 9-12 explored the intricacies of Karnataka's Culture through an excursion to Shravanabelagola, Belur, Halebedu and Chikmangalur. The primary objective of the excursion was to provide the students with a cultural and historical experience, enriching their understanding of Karnataka's heritage and architecture.

The students, through a guided tour, visited the Hoysaleswara Temple, in Halebidu, the gem of Hoysala architecture and the former capital of the Hoysalas, famous for its detailed carvings and sculptures depicting Hindu mythology; the Chennakesava Temple at Belur, renowned for its exquisite Hoysala architecture and learnt about the historical and cultural significance of Hoysala art and architecture of the Chennakesava Temple, marvelling at its intricate sculptures and craftsmanship. Chikmangalur, known for its picturesque landscapes and coffee plantations, provided a refreshing natural break during their Visit to a local coffee plantation to learn about coffee cultivation and processing. They enjoyed the serene environment and learnt about the local flora and fauna, spiced up with a camp fire to cherish in memory forever.

The excursion to Shravanabelagola, Belur, Halebidu, and Chikmangalur, enhanced the students' insights about Karnataka's rich history, particularly the Hoysala and Jain influence in architecture and culture. They appreciated the significance of religious sites and their impact on local and national culture.
